# Holiday Resource Guide: OLD BROOKLYN IS OUR PURPOSE

Winter is upon us here in Old Brooklyn and with the cold and snow comes fun times with family and friends. Holiday celebrations, parties, sled riding, sports, and events all around the greater Cleveland area keep us busy and entertained. Along with the ugly sweaters and spiced eggnog can come stress and anxiety, whether it's being overwhelmed in social settings or how you're going to provide a sufficient holiday meal.

A local organization that assists residents in need is Senior Citizen Resources (SCR). SCR works to support Old Brooklyn seniors in staying healthy and living independently through transportation, nutrition, activities, social services, and volunteering. Throughout the year, SCR works with Meals on Wheels to provide 130 meals, 5 days a week to homebound seniors.

If you want to give back this holiday season and beyond, they are looking for assistance with this program! Volunteers in teams of 2 commit to one day a week to a route, either once a week or once a month. Routes take about 1 hour to complete. If this is of interest to you, contact the SCR main office at 216-749-5367 for more information.

Along with SCR, Old Brooklyn and the surrounding areas have many additional resources to help your family with food, clothing, and other essentials.

#### **Grandmas Sweet Bread**

Recipe Submitted by: Sandy Worona Makes 2 Loaves



#### **Ingredients: Bread**

- 2 pkg. instant yeast
- 1/4 cup lukewarm water
- 2 teaspoons white sugar
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 cup butter
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 3 eggs
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 4 1/2 cups flour

#### **Ingredients: Crumb Topping**

- 4 Tablespoons sugar
- 4 Tablespoons butter
- 6 tablespoons flour
- Mix all together to form crumbs

#### Instructions:

- 1. Soften yeast in lukewarm water and 2 teaspoons of sugar.
- Scald Milk (warm milk until it begins to boil)
   Add butter, sugar and salt to scalded milk and
   stir to disolve.
- 3. Cool milk until lukewarm
- Add yeast and beaten eggs to 2 cups flour-Beat well then add the rest of the flour
- 6. Place in greased bowl, cover and let rise for about 2 hours
- 7. Grease 2 loaf pans add dough and add crumb topping to top of dough.
- 8. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 25 to 30 minutes or until top is brown.

#### **Ham & Swiss Sliders**

Recipe by: Graceful Little Honey Bee

Servings 12 sliders



#### **Ingredients:**

- 1 package Hawaiian Sweet Rolls 12 count
- 18 slices of thin deli ham
- 12 slices swiss cheese
- 1 stick butter
- 1 tbsp yellow mustard
- 1/2 tbsp Worcesteshire Sauce
- 1/2 tbsp dried minced onion•
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- Parmesan cheese optional
- dried parsley optional

#### Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375°F. Cover 9×13 baking pan with foil. Spray with cooking spray.
- 2. Remove rolls from package in one piece.
- 3. Cut entire slab of rolls in half lengthwise. You will end up with one slab of tops and one slab of bottoms.
- 4. Place bottom slab in foil covered pan.
- 5. Layer with half of the ham, then the Swiss cheese, then the rest of the ham.
- 6. Add top slab of rolls.
- Melt butter in microwave and whisk in remaining ingredients (except parm. cheese and parsley). Pour evenly over rolls
- 8. Cover with foil and let sit for 5 10 minutes.
- 9. Bake covered for 20 minutes
- 10. Uncover and cook 5 additional minutes.
- 11. Optional Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese and parsley.
- 12. Slice into individual sliders and serve warm.

For a drier, crispier slider you may cut the amount of butter in half to a 1/4 cup.

As the year wraps up and the season begins to change, Old Brooklyn Community Development Corporation (OBCDC) hosted their Annual Meeting. On October 24, neighborhood residents, business owners, and members of OBCDC joined the staff and board for their Annual Meeting.

This years' meeting saw OBCDC Executive Director Lucas Reeve and Dr. David Margolius, outgoing OBCDC Board President, open the meeting and welcome the membership. Gathered in the hall of the Cleveland Maennerchor located at 4515 State Rd, we heard remarks from both Council people representing Wards 12 & 13, Councilwoman Rebecca Maurer and Councilman Kris Harsh respectively.

# BUILDING A FOUNDATION FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS

There's a photo of my mother that has wedged itself in my memory. She's dressed in a pale pink button up and light wash, straight-leg jeans. Crisp, white, all-American Keds peek out beneath the denim and a black mass of permed curls splays out like a halo around her bright face. She's perched on a thick branch of an old oak tree, beaming down at my father who is snapping the picture. It's 1986 and they've just bought their first home, my childhood home.

That tree is the entire reason my parents bought our house. To hear my mother tell it, it was love at first sight. The sprawling branches reached out to her and painted the broad strokes of their unfolding life. Looking at that oak tree, she saw her future children running dizzying circles around its expansive trunk, reading from picture books under the cool shade, clambering up the web of limbs in a race to the top. With one look, she knew that this was where her family was to be built.

Nature seems to lend itself to building memories. I'm sure there's a time you remember ambling down a park's tree-lined path and confiding in a friend. Or maybe you've sat under a blossoming cherry tree, cheeks flushed with the summer heat, and confessed your love. There exists a certain honest hopefulness that feels full of potential, creating the backdrop to life's pivotal moments. However, I fear that our greenspaces

and trees have become the backdrop we've taken for granted.

It's an undeniable fact that our tree canopy is shrinking at an alarming rate. After decades of irresponsible land development, climate change, and removing trees on the basis of aesthetics, we are now faced with a stunted environment. But it's not too late!

OBCDC and the Old Brooklyn Tree Stewards are working together in order to rebuild what we have lost. Old Brooklyn residents are now able to get a tree planted on their property, at no cost, through the Reforestation Program. As both a steward myself and a resident of the neighborhood, I feel incredibly grateful for the opportunity to restore the greenery of our surroundings and invigorate our community identity.

While there are dozens of tangible benefits to increasing our tree canopy-such as improved

health, lower temperatures and energy bills, and promoting biodiversity – there's also an imperative need to satisfy our spirit. Our work as tree stewards is enabling future generations to experience the same sacred formation of memories that we had as children.



# From the Island to the Land: **BRINGING THE 787 TO THE 216**

If you're driving down Memphis Avenue into Old Brooklyn, you can't help but see the bright, colorful 'Little Puerto Rico' mural on the side of 787 Market. It might be a recent addition to the building, but it's been in the works since the shop opened in 2020.

Harry Quiñones, owner of 787 Market, not only wanted to make products from Puerto Rico available, but also had a vision for sharing his cultural heritage with Old Brooklyn and the wider Cleveland community.

#### The Idea

Starting a small business is a journey and Harry began his at Cuyahoga Community College as a freshman. He knew he wanted to be in business for himself, even before starting school at Tri-C, so he utilized the experiences he had to help build connections and develop a plan.

As Harry shared his story, he said, "I wanted do something true to myself, my culture, and my heritage; I always wanted to do a Puerto Rican concept."

You might be surprised to learn that before the concept of a market, Harry had originally planned on opening a restaurant. However, that idea shifted as his plans developed and he began sharpening his focus. This led to the idea of a coffee shop that would have elements of traditional Puerto Rican coffee shops with imported, traditional foods, flavors, and products from the Island itself.

#### **Developing a Strategy**

Harry will tell you that Tri-C was fundamental in getting to where he is today. He is a big advocate for educational opportunities, while also understanding the importance of real-life experiences. He received a full scholarship through the Mandel Scholars Academy at Tri-C that led to him attending the Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Honors College at Cleveland State University.

However, while he was attending Tri-C, Harry pushed himself to get out of his comfort zone by going to their Eastern Campus in Highland Hills. This afforded him the opportunity to meet first-time college students like himself and non-traditional students who had life experience while going back to school. This atmosphere aligned with his motivations, furthering his belief in his concept and his desire to work for himself. In 2019, he transferred to CSU, where he discovered the Small Business Development Center at the Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship.

Throughout these experiences, Harry continued refining the 787 Café concept. Throughout his first year at CSU, Harry was already preparing for his future endeavor by buying shelving, refrigeration, and other items to successfully open



a business. It was also during this time that he was doing market research and developing relationships to import supplies, products, and goods from Puerto Rico. He mentioned that at that time, the Café "was the main emphasis, and there was going to be a little market section with goods and merchandise with Puerto Rican items that would tie into the culture."

But, it was costly to open a coffee shop at that time, and he "really wanted the focus to be on using ingredients imported from the Island - for example, the shaved ice syrups used at the Old Brooklyn Takeover events [this year] were from Puerto Rico." During this time, he realized that the struggles of getting, obtaining, and bringing the products from Puerto Rico were the same struggles his associates in the grocery industry were facing and he realized, "If we're already bringing the products in, why don't we sell them?"

He saw a clear need for it in the city. "Everyone currently in Cleveland has to travel outwards to Lorain, Akron, or the other side of the county—there was a demand for Puerto Rican products." And that is where the concept of his store was born: 787 Market. He never believed that he would be in the grocery industry, but the idea of a coffee shop shifted to a small convenience store that focused on specialty items representing his heritage and culture.

#### **From Concept to Reality**

Before his final year at CSU, Harry traveled around the United States to Chicago, Florida, Connecticut, and other places to explore Hispanic markets. He wanted to understand and know how they operated, what they sold, and learn from their success. He wanted to know his market. During his final year at CSU, Harry utilized the Small Business Development Center to write a very successful business plan based on everything he'd learned.

Harry mentioned, "They helped me write a business plan. People think you use [a business plan] to secure loans from a bank, and yes that's true. But the main reason for your business plan is that it's your game plan, your road map. It's your play book for running your business. That center helped me write a great business plan." As all this was happening, Harry secured a location and received a liquor license from the State of Ohio. And his concept was moving toward reality. Over the next few months, he worked to get everything up and running.

He opened his doors to 787 Market on November 19, 2020.

#### **Community Response**

His first customer walked in at 8:48am on November 19. He remembers the exact time. People trickled in after that, but soon it was crowded. By 10am, 787 Market was packed. By 3pm, he was overwhelmed by the response. As we talked, you could still hear how unbelievable the experience was. And how grateful he was to the community for supporting him and his business.

The first few days were so successful, Cun that they had to close for an hour to restock on the third day because they ran out of product! He remembers posting, "We feel so blessed, thank you."

#### What's Next?

Harry said it wasn't always easy; there have been days when no one would come in but that made him double down and motivated him to make it. He treats his business like a start-up, and that made him able to continue to scale up. Harry's philosophy is: "Be the best resource for your community. The more money you make as a business the more you can do for your people, for your community." They were able to transition from their original smaller space, to the adjacent storefront where The Pour House Memphis was previously located, eventually buying the building. The expansion provided more space and their growth has continued!

Now occupying the other side of the building, the store's previous footprint could be reimagined. Harry now had the opportunity to realize his coffee shop concept, 787 Café. It will have the same core as his original vision with a few changes. It will have a lighter menu of options such as Caribbean pressed hot sandwiches, empanadas, Puerto Rican street food like potato balls, fried corn fritters, fried plantain fritters, etc.

As for coffee beverages, Café con Leche is a must. It's a latte-style espresso drink that tends to be a little stronger than a typical latte. Anyone who gravitates toward a latte will enjoy it. You will also be able to order frappes! There will be a limited selection of flavors (around 5-6) to start, but you can expect it to grow!

In addition to coffee beverages, natural juices like orange and passionfruit will be offered. Beyond the delicious food and beverages, there will be a limited selection of merchandise, too. You can expect coffee beans, Caribbean cocoa, mugs, and more.

Harry even hinted that apparel may make an appearance at some point in the future! 787 Café is a modern version of a Puerto Rican coffee shop. Harry described the shop as "a welcoming space; a place for anyone to have a safe, inviting space, while also sharing my culture. That's the beauty – [culture] is meant to be shared!" The café is set to open this Winter.

#### The Mural

Three years in the making, since 787 Market opened in 2020, the idea of a "Little Puerto Rico" has been ruminating in Harry's imagination. And now there is a bright, visible example of his passion and vision on Memphis Avenue.

The "Little Puerto Rico" mural was completed in the early fall of 2023, just in time for Hispanic Heritage Month which was September 15 through October 15. The mural depicts "Calle 787," a set of brightly colored buildings painted to resemble what you'd see in Puerto Rico. It was painted by artist Aldonte Art and supported by Old Brooklyn Community Development Corporation (OBCDC) for the enjoyment of all Latinos in Cleveland. OBCDC was able to help Harry secure funds for the mural and assist in the process for permitting and approvals through the city of Cleveland.

Since the mural was unveiled at the beginning of October, the response has been overwhelming, even going as far to "make it back to the Island." It was broadcast by media outlets in Puerto Rico—truly an unexpected highlight when he began this project. The original post on the 787 Market Facebook page had over 8K likes, almost 7K shares, and more than 2K comments. The mural garnered even more followers via social media for the shop and future café.

Harry Quiñones might be focused on 787 Market and Café right now, but he has a vision to share his heritage and culture with the community. As the coffee shop gets closer to opening, Harry shared how excited he was "to serve the Memphis area, Brookside community, and Old Brooklyn as a whole. This is an open space, available to everybody and we just want to share a little piece of our Island with Old Brooklyn. Little Puerto Rico is for everyone."

## **BUILDING CONNECTIONS ACROSS OLD BROOKLYN**

Cleveland Vibrator Company is a long time Cleveland company, celebrating their 100th Anniversary this year. You may wonder why this is an important piece of information. Not only is Cleveland Vibrator Company a vital industrial organization to our neighborhood along the Hinckley Industrial Parkway, they have been instrumental in assisting OBCDC expand its reach to their neighbors along the Industrial Parkway.

While Old Brooklyn CDC prides itself on being able to connect community members together to build strong neighborhood networks of residents, business owners, and workers with a variety of events, programs, and initiatives, there are still areas of the neighborhood that connections can be formed. With the support of Cleveland Neighborhood Progress, OBCDC enthusiastically created a pilot program with the specific goal of formulating relationships with the industrial and logistical businesses along the Hinckley Industrial Parkway.

A unique geography and a freeway running through, has made it challenging to connect with that area of the Old Brooklyn neighborhood. Hinckley Industrial Parkway is separated from Old Brooklyn by the Jennings Freeway, which blocks the natural connections that small businesses typically have with their surrounding neighborhood. Large buildings generally not open to the public for walk-in access, dampen natural connections made by coffee shops, bookstores, and bakeries in neighborhood commercial corridors.

To begin developing a relationship with the businesses along that corridor, OBCDC held two events over the summer to build the foundations across the board of a mutually beneficial relationship between the neighborhood and the businesses along the Industrial Parkway.

The first event was developed for the managerial staff of the businesses along the Parkway. A breakfast networking session hosted at one of the neighborhood's gems, Cleveland Metroparks Zoo, was fundamental in introducing key resource providers to the industrial management staff. Par-





ticipants included JobsOhio's regional economic development partner Team NEO, the Cleveland Industrial Retention Initiative, Cuyahoga County Department of Economic Development, the City of Cleveland Department of Economic Development, Cleveland Neighborhood Progress and representatives of both Old Brooklyn's City Council Offices. After the event, attendees provided vital feedback that was used to cultivate the second phase of the pilot program.

The second event was a BBQ lunch aimed at connecting the parkway employees with OBCDC and Old Brooklyn. This lunch was inspired by a connection with Cleveland Vibrator Company at OBCDC's first event and assisted in addressing their desire to activate the area around the Parkway. Over 170 people from different businesses along the Parkway attended and were introduced to OBCDC and the wonderful Old Brooklyn neighborhood. Local business directories were passed out highlighting services and amenities available in the area, like daycares, banks, schools, and more.

Ultimately, this pilot program was all about bringing communities together and making the neighborhood a stronger and more vibrant place. The industrial and logistical businesses supply stable nearby employment opportunities for the surrounding neighborhood, helping families set up roots to become lifelong members of our community.

In addition, there has been an increased interest in championing future social causes by volunteering in various ways in the community and supporting local businesses for lunch, day care, coffee, and other day-to-day services. OBCDC looks forward to continuing these efforts into the new year to develop and strengthen partnerships with this critical area of our neighborhood and would like to say a special thank you to Cleveland Vibrator Company for paving the way to making it all possible.




